- The application is made up of tables with relevant data and divided into tabs of subject matter.
- The data in this application is fairly limited to each user or group. Families form a group and individuals logged in are users. What the user can see and edit or delete is controlled by the family admin person (user).

Tabs and Tables

- Members Tab (Family Members Table)
- Documents Tab (Documents & Images Tables)
- Events Tab (Events Table)
- Family Tab (Spouse & Relationships Tables)
- Military Tab (Military Table with associated Accomplishments table)
- Residence Tab (Residence Table)
- Support Tab (Has tables that the user is allowed to see and use)
- Admin Tab (The Admin Tab is only there when signed in as an admin user)

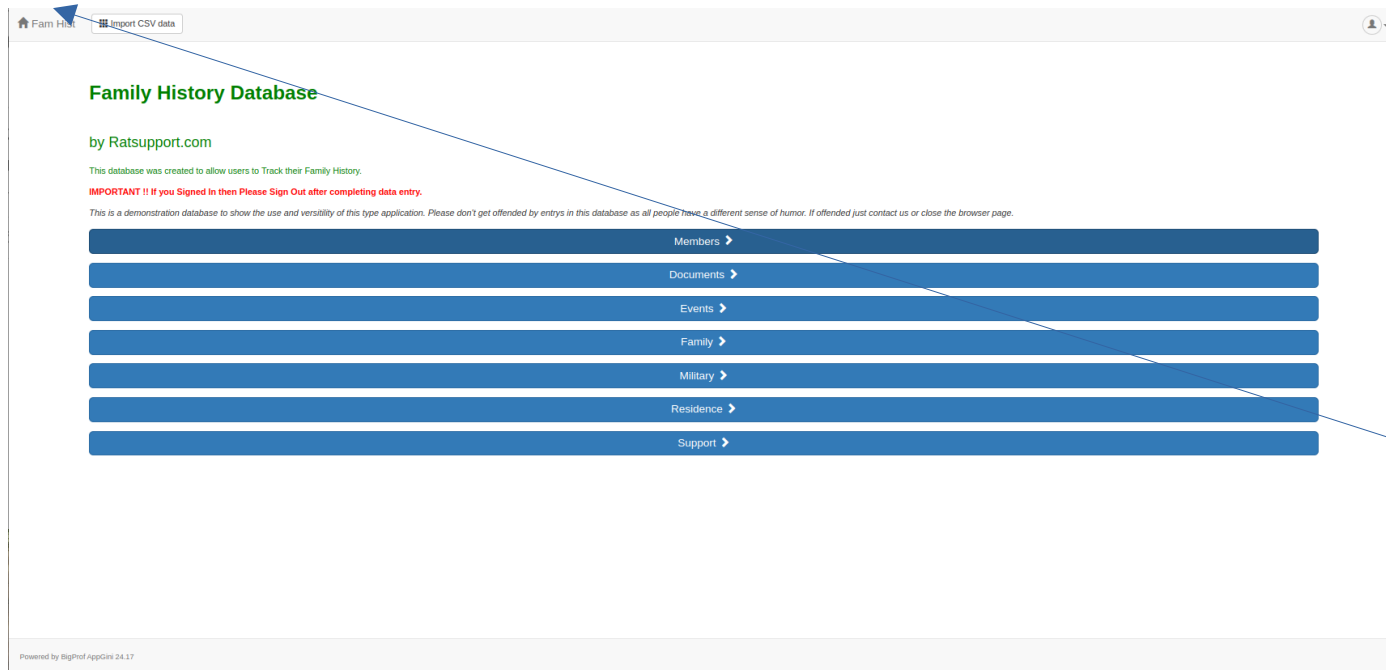

Family Members Detail View

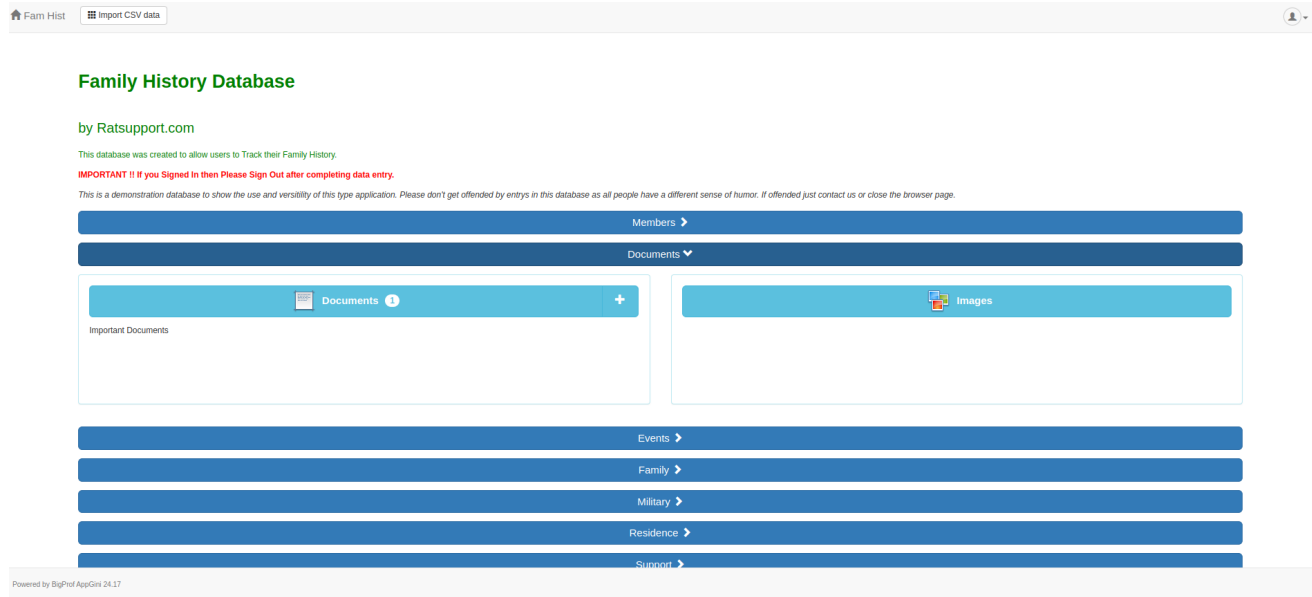

The Detail View's are where the users enter, edit and delete data that they are allowed to process.

A user may only be able to view some data. In this application deleting data is only allowed by the person that entered (own's) the record.

Relationships Table

- The Relationships Table is unique as it needs data to be entered in the proper places and it is not always clear where proper is.
- The entries are in relationship to the Members Table and the two fields to be used are Member 1 and Member 2.
- To Define a Relationship one must enter the Member 1 data first and the Member 2 data second and then the relationship will be the Member 2 person in relation to the Member 1 person.
- If Richard is Member 1 and Ryan is Member 2 then the relationship is Member 2 (Ryan) is the Son of Member 1 (Richard)

Here is the Relationships Table View and you can see that it can be a bit confusing.

Just remember that the Member 2 person is the relation of Member 1 and the Relation will be clear.

If you are creating a new Relation then the same holds. Always the relation is the Member 2 to the Member 1

The pull downs give the user the option to select the Member 1 etc.

Be sure to save after entry.

Only the owner of a record will be allowed to delete a record.

Conclusion

- This Database has important information and needs to be kept secure.
- There are many tables not covered in this presentation but the one's shown are examples.
- Most data is entered into the Main Data Tables and the data in the support tables is entered by use of the + button or the eye button for editing.
- Only the owner of a record can delete a record.
